From the Director

It's been another incredible year here at Hunt Hill!

As you will see within this report, we've seen program participation rise back to our pre-Covid numbers! We continue to have incredible support from our volunteers, sponsors and donors. We continue to create a sanctuary that preserves, respects and makes accessible the incredible diversity and beauty of this amazing place to the public.

In addition to what we've highlighted within this report, I want to take a moment to share a few other highlights of the year:

- New Building** - Of course I have to mention our new amazing building, made possible because of the generosity of Marcia Grand and Dave and Carolyn Cleveland. A dedicated committee of volunteers worked for nearly 2 years to plan for and support the creation of the building. This included: Tom Vonasek, Carolyn Cleveland, Sage Dunham, Nick Allen, and Mike Harvey. Special thanks to the many talented individuals involved in making this project a reality and special thanks to Monarch paving for donating our new walking path.
- Land Use Ad Hoc Committee** - This ad hoc committee was formed at the end of 2022 to "review existing land and facility projections, from such sources as the Long Range Planning Committee (2015), Strategic Planning (2021), current Building Committee discussions, historical documents, as well as input from existing standing committees to create an umbrella plan to harmonize land and buildings with Hunt Hill's mission." This group has put in a lot of time and effort to gather, review and summarize the findings, and it has been a pleasure to rediscover information about the property.
- Great New Addition** - Each year I think, 'It can't get better than this'...and somehow it does! Marissa joined our team at the start of our busiest season and not only survived, but completely dominated at every activity and challenge that came her way. She led a talented team of summer staff and at the end of the summer received some of the best staff evaluations I've ever seen. We are so lucky to have her join our team as Program Coordinator!
- Great Internet** - It FINALLY happened! After years of struggling through slow and unreliable internet, we received a Starlink unit to get us through until we were able to successfully connect to fiber internet in November. We look forward to better productivity, improved sanity and to sharing this improvement with our guests.

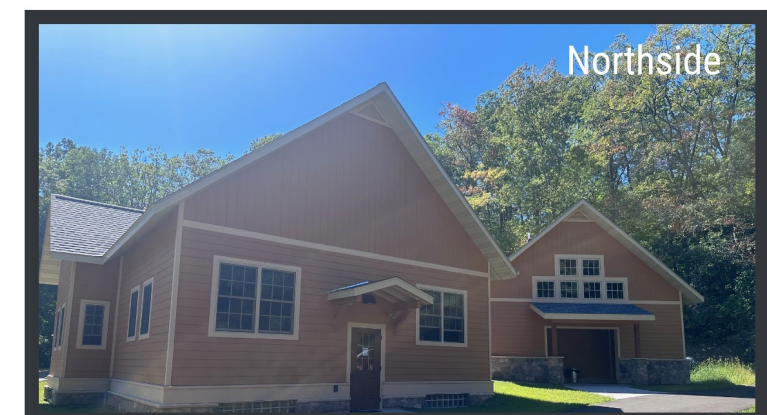
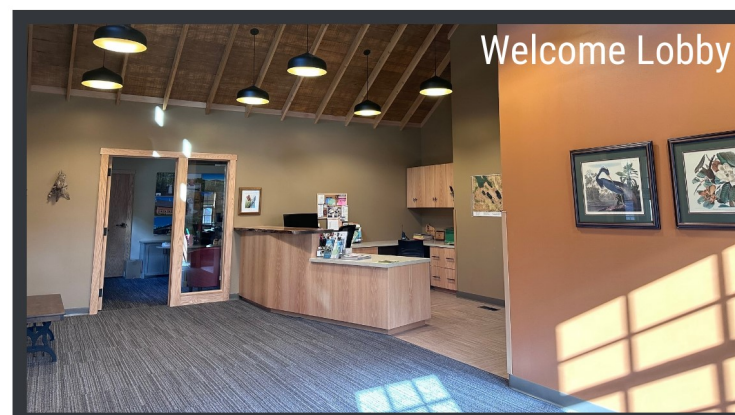
Our New Building

Visitor Center, Offices, Storm Shelter, Laundry, Showers and Public Restrooms

Thanks to the incredible generosity of Marcia Grand and Dave and Carolyn Cleveland we were able to design and build a new building! Construction started in September of 2022 and occupancy of the building began in July of 2023. This new building addresses a long list of needs we had, including:

- * A Visitor Center that is accessible and features nature displays and visitor information,
- * Offices to accommodate our growing staff,
- * Basement area to serve as a safer and more centrally located storm shelter,
- * Climate-controlled sick room
- * Laundry facilities that are accessible,
- * Shower and changing facilities that are more secure and accessible,
- * Public Restrooms that could be operated year round, and
- * Dry storage for our archives and files.

Other features of the building include: a freeze-proof water fountain and bottle filler for visitor use year round, shower house walls covered in the wood salvaged from the old shower house, year round all-gender bathroom, and local business work and pieces featured throughout.



Memberships

We began using new software in 2023 for online program and memberships registration. This has allowed our members (and non-members) to create accounts and register online with a credit card. While there have been a few challenges, it has proven to be a great timesaver for our staff and, hopefully, beneficial for our users.

Restricted Funds

Hunt Hill is fortunate to receive donations from our supporters. Occasionally, the donation will be given for a specific goal like our beautiful new office and showerhouse.

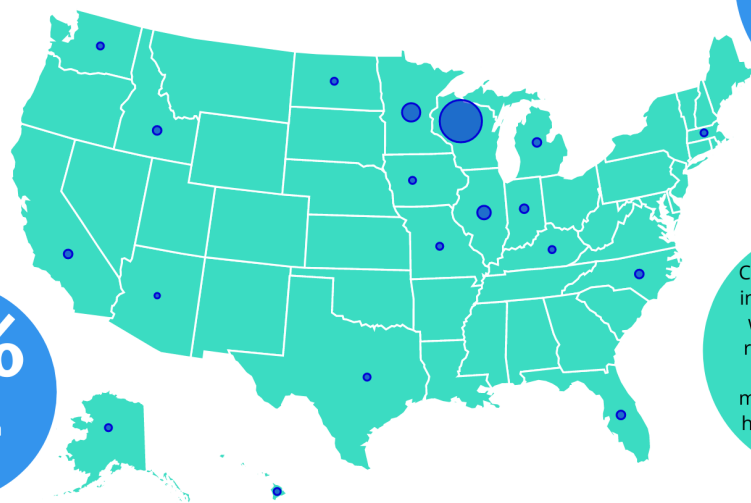
That type of large donation can misconstrue the look of Hunt Hill's income. The restricted donation can only be spent to achieve the goal of the donor.

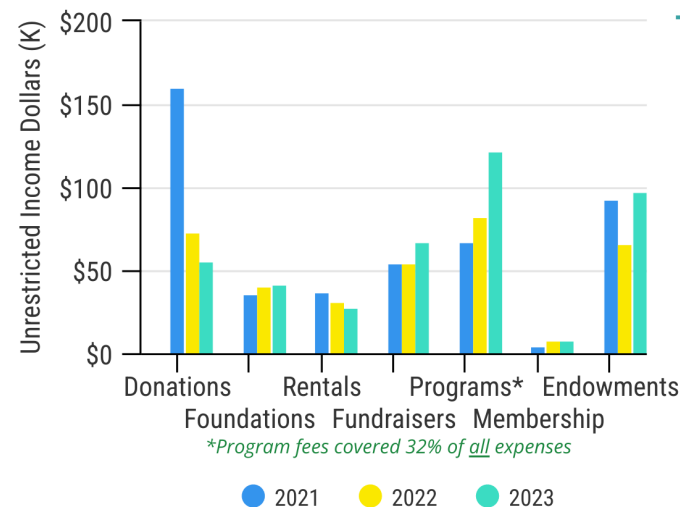

Restricted -vs- Unrestricted Income

Designated Donation income is given for a specific use like an endowment, a particular project, or specific equipment purchase. Unrestricted is for any use.

Total Endowment Funds

- We have \$3,964,204 in endowment accounts. We are able to withdraw up to 4% of the 3-year rolling average from each account as long as the balance doesn't go below the original amount gifted.
- It was decided by the Board to withdraw \$50,000 from the endowments at the end of 2022.

Year-end audited financials will be available, upon request, after June, 2023.

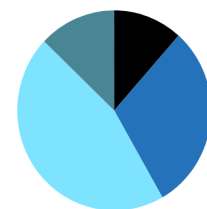

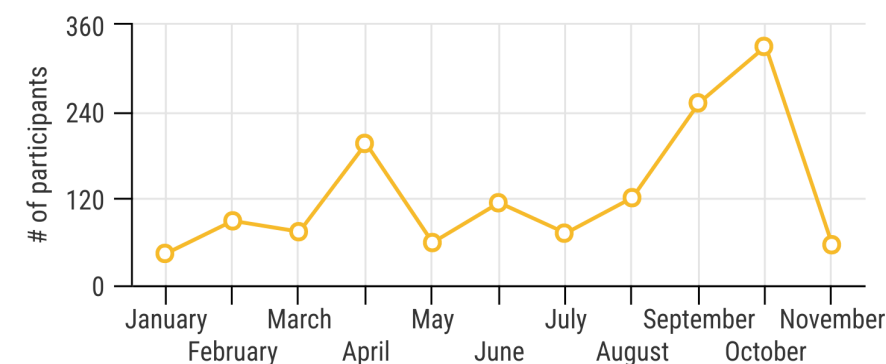
2023's Summer Environmental Educators

This year, we have expanded our 'traditional' programs to include a free Little Explorers program series that is intended for 3-6 year-olds. We had 153 participants in nine months due to the program's well-received status in the community.

In April, we held our first Annual Earth Day Celebration and connected with 70 participants. This is also the first full year we have used our registration system, Perfect Mind, and though we encourage pre-registration for most of our programs, we welcomed walk-ins, which have led us to estimate our total number of participants instead of providing an exact amount.

This summer, we partnered with WisCorps once again and secured four inspirational Environmental Educators, who were crucial in making the season a success. We adjusted our Youth Day Camps to be open to 7-12 year-olds, with 20 individual days over five weeks of summer, Monday through Thursday. There was a decrease in 2023 Cakes at the Lake attendance, which may have been caused by other community events happening on the same day.

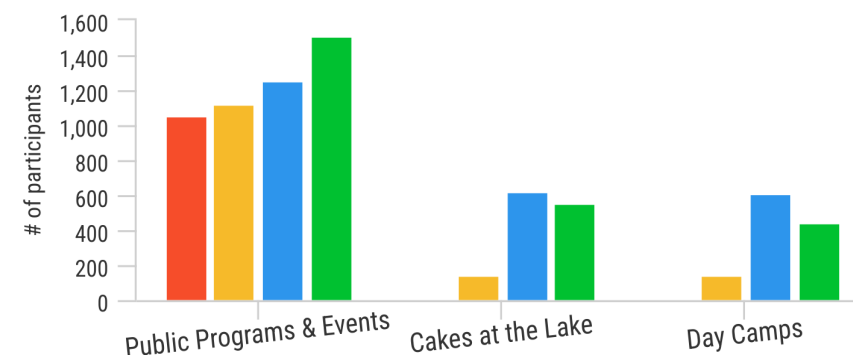
Number of Participants by Month

A Glance at 2023 Contracted Programs & Facility Rentals

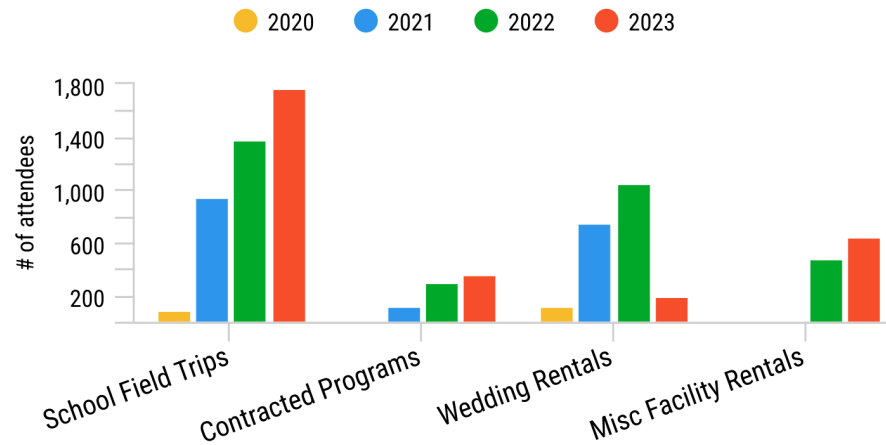
Contracted, Outreach & Rental Groups

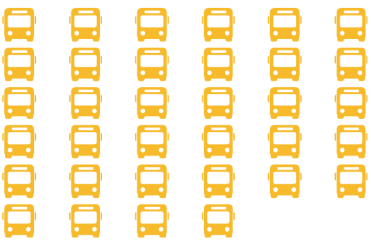
Attendees per Group Type



Reflections on Groups in 2023

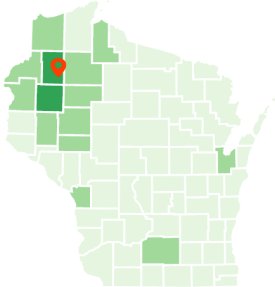

We provided **34** days of school field trips in the spring and fall of 2023, which were attended by a total of 1,775 students.

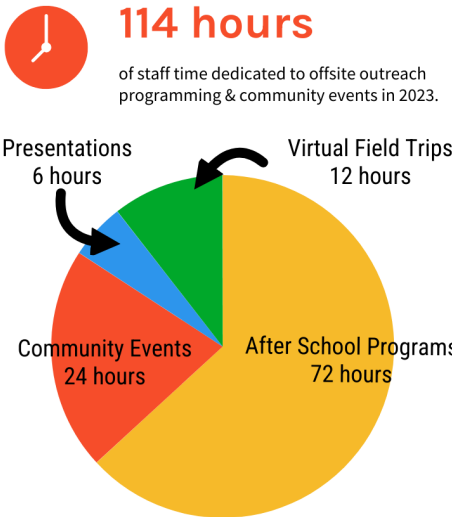
External Group Locations
